CALL FOR PAPERS, SYMPOSIA, ROUND TABLES, WORKSHOPS

2008 Annual Congress, *University of British Columbia*
Vancouver, British Columbia, June 2 to June 5, 2008

ALL SUBMITTERS:

- 1) All submitters must be current members of the CPA. On-line payment is available through the CPA web site; see address below.
- 2) All papers, proposals for symposia, round tables and workshops must be forwarded electronically, .RTF preferred, to the Executive Director (acpa@uottawa.ca).
- 3) Individuals interested in commenting on papers should contact the Executive Director by 15 January 2008. Please indicate if you are willing to comment in English on papers delivered in French.
- 4) Some travel expenses might be eligible for reimbursement. Please visit our web site.

SUBMITTED PAPERS:

- 1) All texts must be submitted in French or in English to the Executive Director (acpa@uottawa.ca) by **midnight, Sunday, 13 January 2008**, stating clearly in which discipline (listed below) the paper should be submitted. In case of doubt, please contact the Programme Chair. Papers submitted by fax or mail **will not be considered**. Greek or Hebrew texts must use WinGreek or the like; logical notations must be in LaTeX.
- 2) Limit of two papers per author; each submission must be sent in separate e-mails.
- 3) Limit of one paper in any one discipline.
- 4) Each paper should be prepared for **double-blind refereeing** on one attachment. The text must not exceed 4,000 words; papers exceeding the length requirement **will not be considered**. The author information must be removed from the "properties" information of the e-document. The word count does not include the bibliography or notes.
- 5) The submission must include the author's name, institutional affiliation, complete mailing address and e-mail address, and an abstract of approximately 75 words on another attachment.
- 6) Please give a **short** title and make sure the title is included with the text and the abstract.
- 7) Students submitting papers should identify themselves as such in order to be eligible for the *Student Essay Prize*. The study level should also be stated: undergraduate, MA, PhD.
- 8) Speakers and commentators will most likely be asked to chair an adjacent session.

SYMPOSIA, ROUND TABLES AND WORKSHOPS:

- 1) Proposals for symposia, round tables and workshops must be submitted by 30 November, 2007. Please include a list of confirmed participants and titles of their talk; **all participating Canadian philosophers must be members of the CPA**.
- 2) Participants can have papers peer-reviewed by following the same procedures as "submitted papers". It must be stated that this paper will be part of a symposium.
- 3) **PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL SYMPOSIA MUST INCLUDE AN ELEMENT IN THE OTHER OFFICIAL LANGUAGE.**
